How to 'Learn remotely'


- Create a routine allocate time when you will do school work. Stick to it.
- Try to **follow your general school timetable** do work related to the subjects you would have been studying that day.
- During that time, turn your phone onto silent and keep all distractions (TV, social media, music) to a minimum.
 Do a variety of tasks watch videos, take notes, try exam questions etc.
- **Keep in contact with your teacher.** They will be available via school email for you to ask questions or have your work checked allow a reasonable time for them to reply.
- Monitor your emails to keep up to date with the work that is being set.
- **Be patient!** Internet may be slow due to the extra requirements from everyone working from home.
- Take exercise whilst maintaining social distance you should not be congregating in large groups.


Sign in with your email address and password previously given to you




Once signed in you should see the following page




Click on the 9 dots as shown below
